



How to contribute to the collective digital artwork



The Wild Escape will be brought to life in an epic-scale collective digital artwork, launching on Earth Day (22 April 2023). The artwork will be live until the end of Great Big Green Week (12-18 June 2023), so you can follow creatures through their new digital home.

The final artwork will include thousands of creatures, all inspired by nature in collections across the UK.

We are looking for images of artwork that:

- have been created by young people in your Wild Escape workshops with schools or public facing programmes and activities
- are drawn, painted, sculpted, or created in whatever creative medium you've chosen!
- feature a creature that lives in the UK landscape

We cannot accept images that:

- include photographs of people
- include text
- are not artworks that have been created in line with your Wild Escape activities with schools and families

How to send us artworks for collective artwork before Earth Day (22 April 2023):
