



How to add pupil artwork to The Wild World



[The Wild Escape](#) is a major new project uniting schools and museums. Taking place from January to July 2023, The Wild Escape invites primary school pupils (ages 7-11) to find a favourite animal in their local museum and create an artwork imagining its 'escape' back to its natural habitat.

The pictures and stories children create are being brought to life in an epic-scale collective digital artwork called [The Wild World](#). More on this on page 2.

How to add your pupils' creations to The Wild World

If you would like to see your pupils' creature artwork in The Wild World, we have two options available to make it as easy as possible for you to do so:

1. Upload each of your pupils' artwork online yourself
2. Send your entire class's artwork in bulk to us via email or post and we will add it all for you, and then email you with codes to find each of your pupils' animals in The Wild World.

You can find full instructions on how to do each option below.

Instructions

STEP 1: Uploading Artwork

Scan or photograph the creature artwork to create a digital colour image – jpeg, PNG, PDF, whatever format is easiest for you. If possible, ask your young artists to note in the corner what kind of animal they have chosen to draw.

Please remember – no photographs of people and no words. Images that break these rules will not pass moderation to be included in the collective artwork – see page 3 for image requirements and terms & conditions.

STEP 2: Sending Artwork

Send us your image(s) using one of the following methods:

Upload Online

Upload by Email

Upload by emailing creatures@thewildescape.org.uk with your image(s) along with this [completed PDF form](#). A [Word version](#) is also available. You can also use [WeTransfer](#) to share your images if your files are too large for email.

STEP 3: Finding your animals in The Wild World

To find your pupils creature in the The Wild World, you will need to have a unique code and enter that into the 'find creature' button:

- If you uploaded your image(s) directly into The Wild World, a unique code will appear after you submit a creature.
- If you sent your image(s) via email or post, we will email you a unique code for each individual creature sent in.

Image requirements

We are looking for images of artwork that:

- have been created by young people in your Wild Escape workshops with schools or public facing programmes and activities
- are drawn, painted, sculpted, or created in whatever creative medium you've chosen!
- feature a creature that lives in the UK landscape.

We cannot accept images that:

- include photographs of people
- include text
- are not artworks that have been created in line with your Wild Escape activities with schools and families
