Introduction with Jenny Waldman, director at Art Fund

- The Wild Escape is an epic-scale project connecting over 500 museums in a phenomenal display of placing art and museums at the centre of the future of biodiversity.

The Wild World - collective digital artwork – processes and sneak peek with Mike Keating, head of digital service at Art Fund

The collective artwork will be revealed on Earth Day, Saturday 22 April, as 'The Wild World'. The project website with resources and information for museums and teachers will start to look very different from Earth Day. We will start to drive the public to the website to create creatures in museums and participate in the collective digital artwork.

- Participants can upload an image onto the website and receive a three-word code which will help them locate their creature in digital artwork once it gets uploaded after passing moderation.
- Through the fast-track process you can submit your images ahead of Earth Day or submit a large group of images.
